QUICK HITS

SUSTAINED EXCELLENCE

- NYU women's basketball won its second consecutive outright University Athletic Association (UAA) title this year, finishing with a 12-2 record in the Association while winning by an average margin of 15.7 points in the league.
- The team became the first back-to-back outright UAA champions since WashU won the league in 2015-16 and 2016-17.
- The Violets currently have the third-highest single-season scoring average in program history (77.4) and are on pace to tie the program's best single-season field-goal percentage (44.9) which was set last year.
- Head coach **Meg Barber** has now led the Violets to their third straight 20-win season. The reigning WBCA Division III Coach of the Year holds an 85-20 overall record in her fifth season at the helm (fourth played season due to COVID-19).
- NYU opened the season on an 11-game winning streak and have won another 11-in-a-row entering the Tournament.
- The Violets currently lead Division III in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.37), rank third nationally in blocks per game (6.9) and ninth in fewest turnovers per game (12.6).
- Nineteen of the team's 22 victories have come by double-digits, including 14 wins of 20+ points, six wins of 30+ points, two wins of 40+ points, one 50+-point win and one 60+-point win.
- NYU's all-time assists leader **Annie Barrett '20** joined the coaching staff this year and helped lead the Violets to another dominant campaign.
- The Violets swept the UAA's major awards this year as **Natalie Bruns** won Player of the Year, **Belle Pellecchia** won her second straight Defensive Player of the Year award and **Caroline Peper** took home Rookie of the Year. Bruns landed on the First Team while Pellecchia and **Jenny Walker** were named to the Second Team.

TEAM LEADERS

- **SCORING:** NYU features five players averaging at least 7.5 points per game, led by **Natalie Bruns'** 14.8. **Belle Pellecchia** is right behind her at 13.1 ppg while **Jenny Walker** averages 12.6, rookie **Caroline Peper** averages 8.3 and **Erica Miller** sits at 7.5 ppg.
- **REBOUNDING:** Bruns has controlled the glass all year, leading the team with 8.2 rpg. Walker pulls down 6.5 rpg while Pellecchia corrals 6.1 boards a night as the team's lead guard.
- **ASSISTS:** With last year's starting point guard **Jordan Janowski** sidelined due to injury, Pellecchia has taken over NYU's primary playmaking duties and ranks second in the UAA with 4.5 assists per game. Bruns has showcased her passing skills as well, averaging 2.9 assists a night.
- **DEFENSE:** The Violets once again lead the Association in scoring defense, allowing just 54.0 points per game, coupled with the league's best scoring offense (77.4 ppg). NYU also leads the UAA in steals per game (9.4) as Pellecchia tops the league leaderboard with 2.7 spg. It's been a block party in Brooklyn this year as well, led by Bruns' UAA-leading 2.9 bpg. Walker is tied for fifth in the UAA with 1.2 swats per outing.

BRUNS BURSTS ONTO THE SCENE

- Junior forward and UAA Player of the Year **Natalie Bruns** had a strong first season with NYU last year, winning the UAA Sophomore Rookie of the Year award and landing on the All-UAA Second Team. However, the St. Louis native has taken her game to another level in 2022-23, setting NYU's single-season program record in blocks (69+), along with the single-game program record for blocks (10) which also tied the UAA single-game record as part of a 16-point, 14-rebound, 10-block triple-double against Carnegie Mellon on 1/27. She is one of two DIII WBB players with a triple-double this year.
- Bruns' 2.9 blocks per game lead the UAA and rank ninth in the country while ranking eighth in the Association in scoring (14.8), fourth in rebounding (8.2), sixth in field-goal percentage (49.8), tied for seventh in steals per game (1.9) and ranks 11th in assists per game (2.9). She is the only UAA player among the top 11 in the league in all of those categories.

TEAM RANKINGS

- NYU is currently ranked sixth in the country by *D3hoops.com* and seventh by the WBCA. The Violets have been ranked as high as first in the nation by *D3hoops.com* and second by the WBCA.
- NYU was ranked third in the *D3hoops.com* Preseason Poll and seventh in the WBCA's Preseason Poll.
- NYU has also been ranked No. 1 in Region IV in each of the NCAA's Regional Rankings

NYU NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- NYU is in the NCAA Division III Tournament for the 22nd time and third consecutive (no Tournament in 2021). The Violets' overall record in the tournament is 34-23.
- The Violets made a run to the Elite Eight of the Tournament last year, defeating Washington & Lee (1st Round), Bates (2nd Round) and Scranton (Sweet 16), before falling to Hope in the sectional final.
- NYU made its NCAA Tournament debut in 1986, falling in the Sweet 16 to SUNY Albany. Nine years later, in 1995, the Violets won multiple games in the tournament for the first time. Then, the following year, the Violets reached the Final Four before losing to University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh.
- Building on its success, NYU went a perfect 6-0 in the 1997 Tournament en route to its first National Championship. The Violets topped the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire in the championship game, 72-70, on **Marsha Harris'** game-winning layup as time expired.

FIRST & SECOND ROUND NOTES

- NYU women's basketball will meet Greensboro for the first time ever on Friday. The Violets have also never played Messiah or Bridgewater State, the two other teams in the first weekend pod. The Violets have an 8-2 record on the road this season and haven't played at a neutral site all year.

COACHING STAFF



MEG BARBER
Head Coach

Meg Barber, who was hired as New York University's 11th women's basketball head coach in June 2018, has experienced tremendous success as Head Coach of her alma mater. Her teams have produced an overall 65-18 record and qualified for postseason play in each campaign.

The Violets produced one of the great seasons in program history in 2021-22, going 25-2 overall, winning the University Athletic Association (UAA) Championship with a near-perfect 13-1 record, and advancing to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament. NYU ranked among the nation's leaders with a .926 winning percentage (tied for 7th), 44.8 field goal percentage (8th), 5.6 blocks per game (tied for 11th), 74.8 free throw percentage (12th), 150 blocks (tied for 13th), +20.4 scoring margin (14th, 77.6-57.3), and 33.8 three-point percentage (18th).

For her efforts, Barber was named Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA), D3hoops.com (Region 4), Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC), and the Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association (MBWA), while she and her assistants were named UAA Coaching Staff of the Year.

Barber's players also earned hardware for their performances. Jenny Walker was selected UAA and ECAC Player of the Year while also earning D3hoops.com Fifth Team All-America honors. Belle Pellecchia was named D3hoops.com National Rookie of the Year, UAA and ECAC Rookie of the Year, UAA Defensive Player of the Year, and First Team All-UAA. Both Natalie Bruns and Jordan Janowski were Second Team All-UAA selections.

NYU did not compete in 2020-21 due to the coronavirus pandemic. However, 13 team members earned UAA All-Academic honors. Janean Cuffee received the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Student-Athlete Award for the second consecutive year and was named First Team College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District 3.

In 2019-20, Barber led the Violets to a 21-6 overall record and a second-place, 10-4 finish in the UAA. NYU qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2016, defeating Emmanuel College in the first round before falling to host Bowdoin College in the second.

That squad broke several team records under Barber's direction, including most three-pointers made (17) and attempted (41) in a game and in a season (275, 781), as well as highest one-season free throw percentage (76.5) and three-point percentage (35.2). Individually, Annie Barrett set the Violets' one-season (202) and career (435) assists records, while Brooklyn Shelton led NCAA Division III and set NYU's one-season free throw percentage record (.992).

Awards were aplenty for Barber's players, as Cuffee was selected MBWA Division III Player of the Year, D3hoops.com First Team All-East Region, First Team All-UAA, All-ECAC First Team, and NYU's Female Junior Scholar Athlete of the Year. Barrett received UAA Co-Defensive Player of the Year and Second Team honors, as well as D3hoops.com Second Team All-East Region, All-ECAC Honorable Mention and Third Team All-Met accolades. Walker was also a Second Team All-UAA selection.

For her efforts, Barber was named ECAC Division III Coach of the Year, MBWA DIII Coach of the Year, and was a WBCA DIII National Coach of the Year Finalist.

In her inaugural season at the helm, Barber led the Violets to a 17-10 overall record, a 6-8 mark in the UAA and to the postseason ECAC Championship. She recorded her first UAA victory when the Violets defeated Carnegie Mellon University 72-64 in Pittsburgh, PA, on January 13, 2019. The season culminated in an 82-74 victory over host Cabrini University in the ECAC Championship Game.

A 2002 NYU graduate with a Bachelor of Arts degree in economics, Barber took over the reins of the women's basketball program possessing a wealth of college coaching experience.

In her most recent position prior to returning to NYU, Barber served as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I Temple University from 2012-16. In her four seasons there, Barber helped lead the Owls to consecutive 20-win seasons and berths in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT) in 2015 and 2016.

Prior to Temple, Barber also worked at the Division I level as the Associate Head Coach at The College of William & Mary from 2005-12. She oversaw all recruiting efforts for The Tribe, who produced the largest Division I turnaround in the nation from the year before she arrived (5-24 in 2004-05) to 16-13 in her first season (2005-06). The following season, Barber helped lead the team to a 20-win season (20-12).

During her seven years at William & Mary, Barber helped develop Kyra Kaylor, the Colonial Athletic Conference (CAA) Player of the Year in 2006, Taysha Pye, a four-time All-CAA selection (2009-12), and Tiffany Benson, the CAA's all-time leading shot blocker.

A four-year member of the Violets who is 10th on the team's all-time scoring list with 1,228 points, Barber served as a captain during her senior campaign and was twice selected First Team All-UAA. She was also named First Team All-ECAC and Second Team D3hoops.com All-Region in 2002. The Violets earned postseason berths all four seasons, including two NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearances and two NY/NJ ECAC Championships. NYU rose to #1 in the national rankings during the 2000-01 season and posted an overall record of 93-18 during her career.

Barber, who went on to earn a Master of Science degree in Sports Business in 2015 from Temple was also a Candidate for Juris Doctor at the Temple University Beasley School of Law prior to returning to NYU.

A native of Hoosick Falls, NY, Barber currently resides in Brooklyn, NY.

ANNIE BARRETT **Assistant Coach**

Annie Barrett, the all-time assists leader in New York University Women's Basketball Team history, returned as an assistant coach in June 2022.

Barrett, a 2020 NYU magna cum laude graduate with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Social and Cultural Analysis, was a four-year team member. Her 435 career assists tops the all-time list, as does her 202 dimes during the 2019-20 season (which also led NCAA Division III).

A two-time team captain, Barrett was named University Athletic Association (UAA) Co-Defensive Player of the Year and was a Second Team All-UAA selection in '19-20.

During Barrett's time as a Violet, NYU posted an overall 70-40 record and advanced to postseason play each season. The Violets won the ECAC (Eastern College Athletic Conference) Division III Championship in 2019 and advanced to the Second Round of the NCAA Division III Championship in 2020.

In addition to her stellar on-court production, Barrett was a three-time UAA All-Academic honoree and was named CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) All-Academic District 3 as a senior.

Barrett played in 91 games as a Violet, 84 as a starter.

After graduating, Barrett served as the Development and Database Coordinator of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester (MA) beginning in January 2021. Previous to that position, she held postgraduate internships at All In Together and Visit.org and undergraduate internships at Team Impact and the Women's Sports Foundation.

A native of Cambridge, MA, Barrett resides in New York City.

NETTIE RESPONDEK **Assistant Coach**

Nettie Respondek began serving as an assistant coach of the New York University women's basketball team prior to the 2018-19 season. Her main responsibilities include both recruiting and on-court development with the Violets' perimeter players. She also assists with game preparation and spearheads the team's efforts to engage with both the NYU and greater NYC community.

For three years (2012-15), Respondek was an assistant at St. Francis College in Brooklyn. She helped lead the Terriers to the Northeast Conference Championship and their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015.

Respondek spent two seasons (2010-12) at Columbia University, working mainly with the Lions' post players and forwards while also serving as the junior varsity head coach. In 2012, she took part in a State Department service trip through Columbia University to Lira, Uganda, teaching 200 adult educators the game of basketball and helping lead a skills clinic for 500 Ugandan children.

Prior to that stint, Respondek was at Fordham University from 2006-10 and served as recruiting coordinator in her final season. While at Rose Hill, Respondek brought in several All-Atlantic 10 players, including Tournament MVP Abigail Corning.

A 1998 graduate of Vanderbilt University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Human and Organizational Development, Respondek went on to earn a master's degree in Human Development Counseling from the Nashville, TN, school in 2000. She was a four-year member of Vanderbilt's women's basketball team and helped lead the Commodores to two NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen appearances and one Elite Eight.

A former Miss Texas Basketball and Gatorade Texas Player of the Year as well as Gatorade Southwest Region Player of the Year for BF Terry High School in 1994, Respondek was one of 20 players selected to the Kodak All-America First Team.

A native of Rosenberg, TX, Respondek resides in Manhattan.

AUDREY CUNNINGHAM

Assistant Coach

A Dean's List student, she played in all 26 games as a freshman and averaged 6.8 ppg. As a senior, Cunningham played in all 28 games and averaged 4.9 ppg. She completed her career sixth on the program's all-time list with 102 three-pointers.
