Mike Miller - Messiah Women's Basketball Coach

Messiah head women's basketball coach Mike Miller doesn't just lead the Falcons program. He is Messiah University women's basketball. Miller begins his 37th year at the helm of women's basketball. His 687 wins are more than any other basketball coach — men's or women's — in Messiah history, while Miller became just the fourth coach in NCAA DIII women's basketball to reach the 700-win plateau on Jan. 19, 2022 with a 70-34 victory at Hood College. Miller currently sits fourth all-time among active coaches in DIII women's basketball in wins.

His 710-246 career record (.736 winning percentage) is impressive, but pales in comparison to what he's done most recently: over the last 23 years, Messiah has reached the NCAA National Tournament 20 times, and during that span Miller has racked up an overall 535-110 record, equating to an incredible .830 winning percentage.

A 1983 Messiah graduate, Miller began coaching the Falcons in the 1986-87 season, his first as a collegiate head coach. He methodically led the program to national prominence, as the 1996 season was the program's first 20-win campaign — producing an overall record of 20-8 — and first NCAA Tournament berth. Since then, the program has only raised its own standard of excellence, recording a minimum of 22 wins per season from the 1999-2000 season to the 2009-2010 campaign. The Falcons advanced to the 2008 NCAA Division III National Championship game, falling to Howard Payne University to finish as national-runners up. Prior to that year, Messiah's 2000-2001 season stood as the most successful in program history, as they also reached the National Championship before falling to the University of Washington-St. Louis.

The 2002-03 team set a school-record 28 wins, a mark bettered by the 2007-08 squad's 30-3 record. Messiah has won 15 of the last 22 MAC Commonwealth Titles. Messiah rattled off 51 consecutive regular-season conference home games victories over an eight-year span that ended in 2010. Winning its six-straight conference championship in 2022, Miller has been at the helm for all of Messiah's conference crowns.

Miller has garnered a variety of awards for his coaching prowess, being named MAC Commonwealth Coach of the Year in 1994-1995, 1999-2000, 2000-2001, 2002-2003, 2006-2007, 2007-2008, 2016-17, 2018-19, and 2021. He was named the NCAA Middle Atlantic Region Coach of the Year in 2002-2003 and a span of 2016-2021. The Falcons made it to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament in 1995-96, 1999-00, 2000-01, 2002-03, 2004-05, 2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10, 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2017-18, 2018-19, and 2019-20 while making it to the "Sweet 16" in 2004-05, 2012-13, 2017-18, 2018-19, and 2019-20. The program qualified to the "Elite 8" in 2003-04, while the 2007-08 season served as a bookend to the team's only other trip to the Final Four in 2000-01.

A coach set on teaching principles both on and off the court, Miller's teams have always achieved in the classroom, evidenced by repeated appearances at the top of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll. Messiah finished with the best team GPA among all NCAA Division III programs following the 2000-2001 and 2001-2002 seasons, and claimed the number two slot following the 2007-2008 academic year. The team has appeared in the Academic Top 25 in 10 of the 14 years the award has been in existence, finishing in the top eight on nine different occasions.

Miller's integrity and dedication to women's basketball has given him the opportunity to serve as a member of the Commonwealth Conference Games Committee and as a member of the NCAA Ranking Committee. He currently serves as a WBCA Commonwealth Conference Captain and as a selection committee member for the prestigious WBCA Jostens Lifetime Achievement Award.

Mike and his wife of 38 years, Norma, live in Grantham, Pa. They have two children, Taylor Keener '14, and son Michael (Gordon College '12). Miller is also a grandfather of two grandchildren, Theo and Ellie.

Making their 22nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the Messiah Falcons earned hosting duties after winning the MAC Commonwealth for the seventh-straight season with a 60-37 victory over the Alvernia Golden Wolves. After starting the season 3-2, Messiah has rattled off 22-straight victories to climb all the way to No. 9 in the most recent Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Rankings.

While the Falcons have not shown the offensive fire power that the other three teams in Grantham this weekend possess, Messiah is stingy on the defensive end. They are allowing just 46.9 points per game the seventh lowest mark in the country this season. Offensively, Messiah has shot the ball at a 41.9 rate from the field, good for 47th in the country, but is averaging 59.0 points per game, the 276th in the land.

Bridgewater State used a massive second-half to win the Massachusetts State Collegiate Athletic Conference (MASCAC) Championship over Westfield State. The Bears trailed 39-20 at the half, but went on for the 64-59 victory to the NCAA Tournament for the 11th time in program history. This year's appearance will be their first since 2015.

The Bears are scoring at the 14th-highest mark in the country with a 76.6 per game average. While their defense is allowing 62.2 points per game, they are forcing north of 22 turnovers per game (32nd in the country). Since the calendar turned to 2023, the Bears are 13-2 and are playing some of their best basketball of the season.

The NYU Violets are making their 22nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament after winning the University Athletic Association (UAA) Championship for the second-straight season. The Violets hold a 22-2 overall record and went 12-2 in the brutal UAA this season. They are ranked No. 7 in the country in the most recent Coaches Poll. No stranger to the NCAA Tournament, NYU holds a 34-23 overall record in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Final Four on three occasions, including their National Championship winning season of 1997.

This year's team features a high-scoring offense that does not like to turn the ball over. On the season, NYU is averaging 77.4 points per game, the 10th highest in the country this season. Their defense has been strong too, allowing just 54 points per game for a 23.4 scoring margin, eighth in the land. The Violets protect the ball, averaging just 7.83 turnovers per game and holding the best assist-to-turnover ratio in the country at 1.37.

The Pride are coming off a 26-2 season, while finishing undefeated in the USA South with a record of 18-0. Greensboro is currently riding a 23-game winning streak. The USA South Tournament Championship win was the seventh conference championship in program history. Greensboro has gone 4-7 in their previous seven appearances in the NCAA Tournament and make their first appearance since the 2014-2015 season.

The Pride features a run and gun offense that is averaging 86.4 points per game, the fourth-most in the country. They can fill it up with the ninth-highest shooting percentage in the country at 45.3. On the flip side, they have played in a number of high scoring games with their opponents scoring at a 65.9 clip, ranking them the 304th best scoring defense in the country. The result has been high-scoring, fun games in Greensboro.
